Are You Missing Out On A Bigger Paycheck?

Dear TOTEM Members-

Did you know that as a member of TOTEM you might be eligible to apply for the Professional Standards Program? Section 507.1 A of our bargaining agreement gives a small glimpse at the pay increases next to each level of certification a member might apply for. This program is one of the benefits of being a TOTEM member, yet so many of our group have never heard of



it or have never taken the time to reach out and find out more. The PSP program is based on job experience, post-secondary educational background, membership with TOTEM, continuing education, and subsequent membership with the National Association of Educational Office Professionals (NAEOP), who sponsors the program.

The education an individual brings to the table determines the percentage of pay increase between 2% and 7%. The PSP certificate is recertified every five years, requires continued membership with TOTEM and NAEOP, and 60 hours of continuing education. Let's stop leaving money on the table! I encourage all members to take advantage of this program to show the district just how educated and highly qualified our Paras are! If this sparks an interest in the PSP program, watch for workshops being listed in My Learning Plan each month and sign up. Class sizes are limited to 10 while we mitigate COVID safety issues. There is no current wait list for each. Class enrollment does close 24 hours prior to the workshop.
